
Beyond Reading and Math




Art and Movement

GoNoodle is a great site to get the whole family up and moving. It offers dancing, exercise, and yoga activities. Best of all it's just plain fun for the whole family!






Virtual Field Trip

Being quarantined doesn't mean you can't see your favorite animals. **Seattle Sea Otter Live** Stream offers you a look into the Sea Otter enclosure.


