The Oakland Literacy Board of Directors is well aware that we must make every important dollar we have stretch even further than it ever did before. We are doing our part by suspending our quarterly newsletter (at least for the time being) and providing you instead with these electronic updates. Our savings, of around \$10,000 annually from the newsletter, translates into three more tutor training sessions and some of the supplemental materials. As most of you know, our mission is to provide basic literacy and English language instruction to adults in order to facilitate lifelong learning, employment skills and personal well-being. We take immense pride in the fact that for over 26 years we have followed our mission to a tee and have helped well over 7500 adult learners. We have had to make some tough decisions these past two years in order to continue offering the same services tutors and students have come to expect. It is therefore with sadness we asked our Executive Director, Carol Moraniec to step down from her position. She has been affiliated with the Council for many years and we wish her the very best. We will be posting the job for an Executive Director in the coming months. In the meantime, it is business as usual. The office will be staffed with long time volunteers well versed in the daily operations of the Council. Our employees play a integral role and as always are willing to step up and assist.
