Imagine fleeing your war-torn homeland because you feared religious persecution – to a country where you couldn't speak the language. Sundus was a civil engineer in Iraq, but, without English skills, she couldn't practice her profession here in Michigan. She had to depend on others for everyday tasks like making appointments and shopping. Two years ago, Sundus began studying with her Oakland Literacy Council tutor, Carole. Now, says Sundus, "I do everything by myself."
