Kenneth Jones, an Oakland County native, is a playwright, librettist, and lyricist. His play, Alabama Story, was a nominee for the Steinberg/American Theatre Critics Association New Play Award and a Finalist in the O'Neill Theater Center's National Playwrights Conference. By fall 2020, the play will have been seen in more than 30 presentations around the country since its 2015 world premiere by Pioneer Theatre Company. The play is inspired by an article in The New York Times about Emily Wheelock Reed, the former State Librarian of Alabama, who had been challenged by a segregationist politician in 1959. Alabama State Senator E.O. Eddins demanded that a children's picture book — Garth Williams' The Rabbits' Wedding, about a rabbit with black fur marrying a rabbit with white fur — be purged from the shelves of Alabama libraries on the grounds that it promoted racial integration. Their conflict was reported worldwide.
