EVENT PURPOSE

In its 33rd year, the annual Ex Libris fundraising dinner is an entertaining and meaningful evening that celebrates literacy and the accomplishments of our students and volunteers.

This year's theme, Writing a New Chapter, puts the spotlight on the courage and resilience of our students to embark on new literacy and life journeys. The lotus flower, our symbol for 2022, represents their strength to grow and flourish despite obstacles.

Ex Libris raises vital funds for the operations of Oakland Literacy Council. As government sources provide less than 25% of OLC's annual budget, we turn to YOU to make sure Oakland County adults can gain the skills needed to fully engage in work, family, and community life.

Your partnership has never been more critical than now.

- OLC has grown in the last several years to serve more adults, offer more programs, and provide more innovative tools and supports to students and tutors.
- It is essential that adults have the foundational skills to qualify for better jobs that earn family-sustaining wages.
- Unfortunately, increased funding during the pandemic that supported the growth is no longer available.

Attendees and Speakers

Each year, Ex Libris (meaning "from the library of") features an author - novelist, non-fiction writer, journalist, playwright, or scholar - who shares their literary and life journey. The guest speaker is joined by students and tutors who likewise share their stories.

Ex Libris brings together leaders and advocates from business, government, workforce development partners, human services agencies, and the community who recognize the power of literacy to changes the lives of Oakland County adults and their families. They are joined by dedicated volunteer tutors, students, and staff.

100-150 guests attend Ex Libris each year. It is publicized to our mailing list of over 3,000 constituents.

In her debut book, Michigan author *Sharon Emery*, who has faced a lifelong challenge with stuttering, shares her journey to "write a new chapter" in her life after the loss of her daughter.




Sharon Emery

Sharon Emery has always had a penchant for communicating, but speaking is a struggle because her voice includes a stutter. Sometimes a bad one. So writing, via journalism, became her voice. To succeed, she knew she had to be better – a lot better – than her peers.

It took some doing, but Emery ultimately forged a career in not only journalism, but also public relations and teaching. She still stutters and now considers it her accent.

Luckily, Emery's stutter taught her a lot about surviving life. And that skill was put to the test when she was faced with the deaths of her two younger siblings and her eldest daughter, Jessica, 25, who had cognitive and neurological impairments.



Emery is a former chair of the *Michigan Disability Rights Coalition Board* and considers equal rights for people with disabilities one of the nation's unfulfilled promises.
